Floyd Fenten Pietz

Floyd Fenten Pietz, DOB 12/31/34, was an adult Boy Scout volunteer in Apple Valley, Minnesota, who was charged with sexually assaulting four boys in 1982. In 1983, Pietz was placed in the Boy Scouts' Confidential Files, making him an ineligible Boy Scout Volunteer.

Pietz was involved with Post 499 in Apple Valley as an advisor from approximately February 1975 to February 1980. He was also a unit commissioner with the Indianhead Council and Chief Little Crow District.

In October 1982, Pietz was charged with 11 counts of first- and second-degree criminal sexual conduct involving four Boy Scouts. The criminal complaint stated that Pietz sexually assaulted the four boys, ages 12-14, several times between December 1980 and October 1982 at Pietz's Apple Valley home, and during camping and fishing trips to Fort Snelling State Park in Mendota Heights, Minnesota, and Crystal Lake in Burnsville, Minnesota. Pietz was investigated by Dakota County (Minnesota) Sheriff's deputies and Lakeville, Minnesota, Police officers following a complaint about Pietz by a Boy Scout official.

Pietz was 47, employed at North Star as a pipe patcher, and married with children, at the time of the charges. He is believed to have resided in the following locations between 1988 at 2011: Apple Valley (Dakota County), Minnesota; St. Paul (Ramsey County), Minnesota; and Edina (Hennepin County), Minnesota.

Pietz died at age 76 on February 4, 2011. His last-known address is believed to have been in Apple Valley, Minnesota.
