

## **Irving W. Beck Jr.**

Irving W. Beck Jr. was an adult Boy Scout volunteer leader from Minneapolis, Minnesota, who sexually abused two Boy Scouts around 1966. As a result, Beck was placed in the Boy Scouts' [Confidential Files](#), making him an ineligible Boy Scout volunteer, in 1966.

Beck was a Scoutmaster of Troop 115 in Minneapolis, Minnesota. Troop 115 was sponsored by Bethany Presbyterian Church. In a written statement dated June 7, 1966, Beck admitted that he "was involved sexually with two boys during recent Scouting events," and resigned permanently from Boy Scouts. Beck's admission and resignation came after two Boy Scouts reported that Beck had sexually abused them. One of the boys stated that Beck "invited me to camp alone with him once, and that he was sexually involved with me at that time."

Beck was approximately 32 years old and lived in northeast Minneapolis at the time he was placed in the Confidential Files.
