

Walter Kise

Walter Kise was born in 1935 in Brooklyn, New York, and served as Assistant Scoutmaster for Boy Scout Troop 36 in Moorhead, Minnesota while attending college there from 1958-1960. In 1960 Kise was arrested for sexually abusing Scouts in his troop. At least one victim was just 11 years old at the time of the abuse. In a 1960 letter, Orland L. Johnson, Scout Director for the Red River Valley Council wrote there was “rather strong indication” that Kise had been abusing children in the Moorhead area the entire two years he was there. In 1963 Kise returned to Brooklyn where he registered to serve as Assistant Scoutmaster of Troop 269. Kise’s name was added to the Boy Scouts’ [Confidential Files](#).
