11/11/50 Newspaper article from the Winonan Ed, Fr. Ferdinand Kaiser resigns as Pastor of Assumption, Canton, St. Mary's, Preble and Nativity Blessed Virgin, Harmony due to ill health (FK00016)

1952 Administrator at All Saints Parish, New Richland, MN

1967 Administrator at St. Jarlath's Church, Iosco, MN

3/21/68 Resigns as Administrator from St. Jarlath's Church due to ill health (FK000001)

5/3/68 Arraignment pleading: State of MN v. F. L. Kaiser, Kaiser pleads guilty for having anal and oral sex with a minor (a 14-year-old boy) at a cabin in Reed Lake in 1967. Kaiser is sentenced to examination, evaluation and treatment at the Rochester State Hospital. (FK00018 – 00024)

7/11/68 Sentencing Proceedings: Sentenced to Via Coeli Institution- ran by Servants of the Paraclete and located in Jemez Springs, New Mexico- for rehabilitation (FK00025 – 00031).

1/3/73 Died in Waseca, MN (FK00001)

1/11/93 Letter from an unknown survivor to Bishop Vlazny regarding allegation of childhood sexual abuse by Fr. Kaiser in the late 1960's. Fr. Kaiser abused both the survivor and her brother. (FK00082- 00083)

2/23/93 Letter from Bishop Vlazny to survivor asking for more information and for the survivor to meet with him and Vicar General Gerald Mahon to discuss the matter (FK00093)
