

# Harlow D. Robinson

Harlow D. Robinson, a/k/a Harlow Dale Robinson, born in 1932, was a Boy Scouts of America (BSA) Scouting Coordinator in Rice, Minnesota, who was convicted of sexual assault in 1983 in Benton County, Minnesota. In 1988, Robinson was placed in the Boy Scouts' [Confidential Files](#), making him an ineligible Boy Scouts of America (BSA) Volunteer.

Robinson was convicted of two counts of Criminal Sexual Conduct in the Fourth Degree in 1983 in Benton County District Court, according to documents in Robinson's BSA Confidential File, including court documents. The convictions involved the young daughter of a friend of Robinson, according to the Confidential File. The court imposed a stay of imposition of sentence for five years and placed Robinson on probation, and ordered him to serve 90 days in jail.

It wasn't until 1988, when Robinson was serving as a Scouting Coordinator for Pack C3120 in Rice, that BSA put Robinson in its Confidential Files and made him ineligible to participate in Scouting. Robinson was 56, and a retired farmer, at that time.

Pack C3120 was a member of Central Minnesota Council of the BSA.

Robinson's last-known address is believed to be in Fergus Falls, Minnesota (Otter Tail County).
